Journey back in time as you learn about the history of state terrorism in Argentina (right-wing death squads against left-wing guerrillas and political dissidents) through an 'Introduction to Human Rights and Argentina History' workshop.

Return to your host family for lunch. Pause for a reflective moment as you review your morning session and make notes in your personal reflective journal. Join your teacher with your first few hours of Spanish lessons.

Evening:

Unwind with some tango dance steps and embrace the culture.

Explore Campo de La Ribera - a former clandestine detention, torture, and extermination centre which was a key feature during the times of state terrorism.

Afternoon:

Anticipate a moment of reflection as you recap your morning session and jot down thoughts in your journal. Immerse yourself in your afternoon Spanish lessons.

Evening:

Share about the events of your day as you enjoy dinner with your host family.

Day 5

Visit D2 Secret Detention centre, a former clandestine prison used for torture. Discuss and begin to process a campaign to promote human rights issues.

Afternoon:

After a well-prepared lunch at the host family, record your impressions in your journal. Then dive deep into Spanish lessons as you endeavor to become fluent in a new language.

Evening:

Indulge in an afternoon snack at the Mona Jiménez Bar Museum. Grab a pizza for dinner before returning home to rest.

It's your time to investigate a little more and create a campaign to help clean the environment. It must also educate and find ways to improve life in the community.

Dine with fellow volunteers at the host family as you record reflections on the morning session. Continue your Spanish classes at the office.

Evening:

Enjoy traditional games like "Dados", "Truco" and "Tejo" before a delicious dinner

Day 18

Wednesday

Jump in and do your part to create a healthy environment as we embark on a garbage collection campaign in "Los 40", a neighbourhood where garbage collection services are often absent.

Afternoon:

Enjoy lunch with fellow volunteers while discussing and recording insights from the morning session. Immerse yourself in your Spanish lessons; there's still much ground to cover.

Rest and relax with your host family.

Morning:


Engage in a review session. Document your experiences of the week and analyse the tasks you have completed. Assess the effectiveness of the campaign and agree on methods to ensure sustainability.

Delve into the architectural marvels and cultural importance of this Jesuit settlement, offering a captivating glimpse into the region's past.
