This two-week Conservation Project takes high school special volunteers to Mexico's stunning coastline, where you'll collect data that will be used across the Americas. In doing so, you build vital skills while improving the environment of the local community.

During this trip, your group will be immersed in the incredible culture of Mexico, learning from local people and broadening your perspective on the world.

This group trip promotes teamwork, protects endangered wildlife, raises cultural awareness, and leaves a positive impact on the lives of local people.

Day 1


Sunday

Arrival in Mexico

On arrival, at Guadalajara International Airport, you head through passport control and look out for a Projects Abroad staff member. They're easy to spot, wearing a bright green staff t-shirt or holding a sign to identify them.

The staff member greets you with a smile and welcomes you to Mexico. You will then be transported by car to the bustling city of Guadalajara where you will overnight at a host family.

In the morning, you will be taken to the laid-back oceanside town of Cuyutlan. Your accommodation is close to a stunning beach.



Day 2

Monday

Travel to Cuyutlan, your house on the beach. Join a tour of the town and a cultural awareness course to help you settle in. You will also be introduced to the work being done at El Tortugario Centre where you will be working for the next two weeks..

After dinner in the evening, you will head out for your first beach patrol as you search for turtle nests and collect the eggs to keep them safe. You will take them back to a protected area created for them.

Day 3

Morning:

Tuesday

Learn from local experts as they explain how the centre operates. Jump right in and begin to clean tanks, monitor the turtle nursery and plant nests as you help the staff to create a sustainable environment for these turtles.

Afternoon:

Grab a quick lunch at the house with your fellow volunteers before engaging in a bird observation walk where you will learn about their different traits and habits..

Evening:

After dinner inner it is time to patrol the beaches and protect the nesting turtles.

Day 4

Morning:

Wednesday

Head to Tortugario to resume cleaning tanks to provide habitable housing for rescued or injured turtles. You will also monitor and care for turtle nests at the nursery.

Afternoon:

Break for lunch at the lodge alongside your fellow volunteers before participating in a mangrove restoration project, which involves activities such as planting mangrove seedlings, removing invasive species, and maintaining the health of existing mangroves.

Evening:

Patrol the beaches for turtle nests and bring back eggs to the nursery for planting in the morning.

Day 5

Thursday

Morning:

100

Today you will focus on cleaning tanks and turtles, and preparing the nursery for planting new nests. Prepare to also feed iguanas as you learn about their habits and dietary preferences.

Afternoon:

Marvel at the natural wonders of the Palo Verde Estuary. Spot crocodiles basking in the sun and flocks of vibrant birds, including herons, egrets, and ibises, soaring overhead

Evening:

Enjoy dinner before heading out in groups to participate in patrols to ensure the safety of nesting sea turtles.

Day 6

Morning:

Friday

Time flies and before you know it, it's time to depart to Melaque for your weekend trip. Pack your swim gear for an awesome weekend.

Afternoon:

Get settled into your accommodation and head out for lunch as you prepare to sample traditional Mexican cuisine. Take a tour of the town and have dinner before returning to the hotel.


Day 7

Saturday

Full Day:

A weekend in Melaque promises a delightful blend of relaxation and adventure, with a boat tour offering a unique perspective of the area's natural beauty.

As the sun rises over the tranquil shores of Melaque, enjoy a leisurely stroll along the sandy beaches, dive into the warm water for a swim, pause for more Mexican cuisine at lunch and enjoy a boat tour. This will offer glimpses of hidden coves, secluded beaches, and rugged cliffs adorned with lush vegetation. Unwind with dinner and a cool sea breeze.



Day 8

Sunday

Full Day:

Enjoy a final swim and bid farewell to the beauty of this region as you depart for Cuyutlan. It's time to continue making an impact now that you are rested and rejuvenated.

Day 9

Monday

Morning:

Grab a quick breakfast before you return to Tortugario where you continue to clean tanks, feed iguanas and monitor the nursery while planting new nests.

Afternoon:

After lunch it is time for a turtle release. As you carefully cradle the turtles in your hands, you will feel a sense of responsibility and connection to these tiny, yet resilient beings. Each turtle carries with it the hope of survival and the promise of preserving its species. Watch as they make their first journey into the ocean.

Evening:

After dinner, continue with beach patrols as there are more nests to protect.

Day 10

Tuesday

Morning:

By now you have become experts at cleaning the tanks and turtles, and monitoring the nursery. You'll check for labels and the general health of the nests. You'll also feed the turtles and iguanas.

Afternoon

Help to secure and enforce the housing for the hatchling nursery. Broken posts need to be replaced, mesh repaired and enclosures constructed.

Evening:

Unwind with some games and a quiz after dinner. Then get ready for the night patrol as assigned. The turtles need you to help them to secure their eggs.

Day 11

Wednesday

Morning:

After a delicious breakfast, it is time to head out for your assigned tasks. Clean tanks and turtles, feed them and plant nests at the nursery. Check for signs of hatching and make sure the conditions are ideal for egg development.

Afternoon:

After lunch, engage in the mangrove restoration project as you plant seedlings to restore and protect mangrove ecosystems. Then head over to the beach as the sun sets for more turtle release. Celebrate as you give these hatchlings a new lease on life. It's an exciting time.

Evening:

Enjoy dinner and games before heading out to safeguard sea turtle nests and nesting females.



Day 12

Thursday

Prepare for an exciting day ahead as you do your part to support the rescued turtles: tank cleaning, turtle cleaning, nursery monitoring and the planting of nests. Don't

Afternoon:

forget to feed the iguanas.

Morning:

With over 300 species of birds recorded in Palo Verde Estuary, every outing offers the chance to encounter something new and extraordinary. So grab your binoculars as you observe and learn about these beautiful creatures.

After birdwatching, grab some garbage bags as we join in a beach clean up and clear the shores of litter and debris.

Evening:

Enjoy dinner and some rest before heading out on your final patrol, to secure eggs and protect the nesting turtles.



Day 13

Friday

Morning:

Rise and shine! Today is your final day working on the Turtle Conservation project. There are still tanks to clean and nests to plant. Feed the iguanas and check up on the turtle nursery.

Afternoon:

Enjoy lunch as you reflect on the lessons learned and the impact made in collaboration with others. Pack your bags and travel to Guadalajara where you will stay overnight in the city before your flight.

Day 14

SaturdayDeparting Peru

The group members will likely be departing at different times, therefore days 13 and 14 may not be the same for everyone. Your exact departure plan will be communicated to you directly by our local team.

You will have the continued support of Projects Abroad staff right until you are safely at the airport.
