Day 2

Join a Community Day where you will support a girls' educational centre through a hygiene awareness program and help with cleaning and wall painting efforts.

Thursday

Engage in an immersive and calm river safari through the serene mangroves of Madu River. Learn about the wetlands ecosystem. Then, visit Cinnamon Island and explore a temple alongside fellow volunteers.

Day 6

Friday

Morning:

Contribute to the vital work of the conservation center's hatchery, supporting the growth and protection of endangered turtle species.

Afternoon:

Finish the informative mural painting session at the center. Prepare for an educational visit by school children next week.

Evening:

Enjoy an evening of board games and dinner at your host family.

Day 7

Saturday

Full Day:

Embark on an exciting journey from Balapitiya to Kandy. Explore a Spice Garden and Tea Factory, learning about herbs, spices, and tea production.

Visit the revered Kandy Temple and enjoy a traditional dance show. Conclude the day with a delicious dinner, experiencing the cultural wonders of Sri Lanka.

Day 8

Full Day:

Sunday

Enjoy a hearty breakfast before visiting a stunning view point for panoramic views. Explore a Wood Carving Factory to witness intricate craftsmanship. Shop for souvenirs at the Kandy Curio Market. Conclude the day with a delicious lunch before heading back to your host family.

Day 9

Immerse in local culture with a market visit for ingredients, followed by a cooking class and shared lunch with your host family.

A local school will visit the Turtle Conservation Center today. The group will educate local students about sea turtle conservation and ocean protection through. Join hatchling releases and participate in awareness programs, inspiring the next generation to safeguard our marine ecosystems.

Journey through time at Galle Dutch Fort, where Dutch architecture meets Sri Lankan culture. Explore Unawatuna Japanese Peace Temple, adorned with ancient rituals. Conclude the day at Jungle Beach, relishing in the serene sunset and enjoying nature.

Morning:


Contribute to the vital work of the conservation center's hatchery, supporting the growth and protection of endangered turtle species.


