Discover the energy of the tropical rainforest at the Camaquiri Conservation Initiative (CCI) and explore the remote Barra del Colorado Wildlife Refuge on the Caribbean coastline.

These locations are critical for many endangered species, as ongoing conservation work plays a key role in preserving Costa Rica's rich natural heritage.

Throughout your trip, you'll practise a range of new skills, such as setting up camera traps, collecting data, and analysing your findings. You'll also monitor monkeys, sea turtles, and birds and participate in reforestation and beach cleanups.

Your help is crucial, as by collecting real data and supporting conservation actions, you directly contribute to protecting local wildlife and fragile ecosystems.

Learn about the values and culture of the people that live in the region. Immerse yourself in a different way of life as you try new food and give back to the local community.

Day 1

Sunday

Arrival in San Jose

On arrival day, a Projects Abroad staff member will be waiting to collect your group from San Jose International Airport (SJO).

Our staff members are easy to spot because they're by the airport exit holding a sign.

A bus will then collect you, taking you to the hotel, Hotel Aeropuerto, where you will spend your first night. Rest well for the busy week ahead.



Day 2

Monday

The adventure begins! Students will begin their journey to the Camaquiri Conservation Initiative (CCI) by bus. The ride will take approximately 3.5 hours. You will stop for lunch on the way as you take in the landscape and enjoy the sights. On arrival at the Conservation Lodge, you will be introduced to your rooms and have the chance to settle in.

Afternoon:

Morning:

In the late afternoon, the group will have their cultural orientation as well as placement and project introduction. Here you will learn about the reserve and how you will help to make a difference over the next couple of days.

Evening:

Relax with dinner at the accommodation followed by your first engaging lecture on Wildlife Monitoring methods and protocols.

Day 3

Tuesday

Morning:

After breakfast, you'll take part in a guided natural history hike, exploring CCI's trail system and learning about the local flora and fauna. This is a great way to develop your knowledge of the area's biodiversity and ecosystems while exploring your home for the next few days!

Afternoon:

Field Work: Following lunch at CCI, you'll participate in a bird survey contributing to ongoing research by documenting bird species along established transects.

Evening:

After a day of hiking and research, you'll enjoy dinner at CCI.

You'll then listen to a lecture about community ecology, using camera traps, and the presentation of recent wildlife findings from CCI's camera trap programme.

Day 4

Morning:

Wednesday

Start the day with a workshop introducing you to camera trapping for wildlife research. Reflect on the lecture from last night and the recent findings from camera traps.

Afternoon:

Remember how we talked about animals and their homes this morning? Well, now it's time to become wildlife detectives! We're going to set up special "trail cameras" in two different parts of the forest: the forest edge and the interior to help us understand how the animals live.

Evening:

After dinner, you'll listen to a lecture about the fascinating world of primate behaviour and ecology, with a special focus on the diverse primate species found in Costa Rica.



Day 5

Thursday

Morning:

Get ready to spot and watch primates as you engage in the primate survey. Surveying primates helps the reserve to track the health of the population and identify if there are any issues with behaviour within the groups.

Afternoon:

Continue the exciting primate survey as you move on to data collection and management. You'll learn how to tell different primate species apart by how they look (size, fur, faces) and what sounds they make.

Evening:

Enjoy dinner with the rest of the group.

Day 6

Friday



Day 7

As you wake up at Barra del Colorado, your focus will be on sea turtles. You'll help set up a special measuring line on the beach at Laguna 9 to study sea turtles.

Afternoon:

Listen attentively to your first lecture on research and monitoring procedures as you will need these skills for the upcoming beach patrol and survey in the night.

Morning:

Day 9

Get ready to plant native trees to combat climate change and restore habitats with local community involvement.

Monday Afternoon:

Let's hit the beach for an epic clean-up, clearing out trash to make sure our amazing wildlife stays safe and sound.

Evening:

Enjoy a delicious dinner before getting some rest for the nightly turtle patrol and survey.



Day 10

Morning:

Get ready to work alongside scientists to conduct a coastal bird survey, identifying and counting incredible bird species that live around the water.

Tuesday

Afternoon:

Let's patrol the beach to find sea turtle tracks and identify their nests, helping us protect these amazing creatures..

Evening:

Dinner will be served at the accommodation. Rest and prepare for the nightly patrol.

Day 11

Morning:

After a delicious breakfast, let us head to the beach and then the town for a fulsome clean up campaign- restoring our spaces one clean up at a time.

Wednesday

Afternoon:

Participate in your final beach patrol as you follow their tracks and protect their nests.

Evening:

Dinner will be served at the accommodation followed by an exciting Salsa dancing session.

Thursday

Get ready for an exciting journey as you depart Barra del Colorado and travel to Cartago, Costa Rica's historic former capital! Once there, you'll embark on a fascinating city tour, exploring its rich history, significant landmarks like the stunning Basilica, and the vibrant local culture before settling into your hotel.

Friday

Morning:

Prepare for an awe-inspiring visit to Irazu Volcano, Costa Rica's tallest active volcano, where you'll explore its unique, lunar-like landscape. On clear days, you might even witness the incredible sight of both the Pacific and Atlantic Oceans from its towering summit!

Afternoon:

For the final afternoon of the trip, the group will be able to buy awesome souvenirs and unique keepsakes for your family and friends at the SyS souvenir shop!

Evening:

The group will enjoy a farewell dinner. This is a chance to say goodbye and thank you to the local staff.
